#### ASX:CCP - Request for Trading Halt

Pursuant to Listing Rule 17.1, Credit Corp Group Limited (ACN 092 697 151) (ASX: CCP) (**the Company**) requests an immediate trading halt in respect of its ordinary shares from the commencement of trading today, Wednesday 29 April 2020.

The trading halt is requested in connection with a proposed equity raising to be conducted by the Company by way of an institutional placement (**Placement**) and share purchase plan. In accordance with Listing Rule 17.1, the Company advises that:

- the trading halt is requested to allow the Placement to take place in an orderly fashion;
- b) the Company anticipates that the trading halt will remain in place until the earlier of such time as it makes an announcement to the market in relation to the outcome of the Placement and the commencement of trading on 30 April 2020;
- the Company anticipates that the trading halt will cease upon it announcing the outcome of the Placement;
- d) the Company is not aware of any reason why the trading halt should not be granted; and
- e) the Company is not aware of any other information to inform the market about the trading halt.
